CRISIS SUPPORT PROGRAM

The CHC Crisis Support Program (CSP) is aimed at helping needy families of CHC achieve a certain degree of self-reliance during times of financial crises.

A. Who is eligible for this scheme?

1. CHC members who are current attendees and are connected to the church.
2. CHC members whose families meet the criteria set out in Section D.

B. How to apply for this scheme?

1. CHC CSP application forms are available from our corporate office at *1 Raffles Boulevard, #05-02, S039593 (Tel: 6737-6266)*. Alternatively, you may download the form from our website at *www.chc.org.sg*.
2. Applicants should submit the completed application, attaching copies of the required supporting documents (as listed out in the Application Form), to the CHC corporate office at *1 Raffles Boulevard, Suntec City, #05-02, Singapore 039593*.
3. Applicants are required to attend an interview by a CHC staff or its appointed agent, who will appraise the suitability and eligibility of the applicants and the merits of the application, and thereafter make recommendations either to approve or reject the application.
4. Applications for CHC CSP and all information and documents submitted to CHC for such purposes will be treated with strictest confidence.

C. Types of support and duration of support

1. Depending on the household's financial situation, successful applicants will receive one or more of the following types of assistance for a period of up to **6 months**, namely:
 - Rental of HDB flats;
 - Utility bills;
 - Service and Conservancy charges;
 - NTUC vouchers;
 - Groceries expenses; and
 - Transport

Note: CHC or its appointed agent reserves the right to determine the amount of assistance in each instance.

2. After the initial assistance period, the family's eligibility will be reviewed and appraised by CHC or its appointed agent to determine if such assistance ought to be continued, varied, substituted or terminated as it sees fit in its sole and absolute discretion.

D. Qualifying criteria

The income limits and other criteria (which are not exhaustive) that would take into account in appraising an application for CHC CSP are set out below:

- Gross household income not exceeding \$2,500 per month or \$650 per capita per month.
- Main breadwinner and other adult family members are looking for work, or unable to work due to illness, old age or unfavourable family circumstances.
